27	Committee again regarding her request. She advised that HIPAA requires all electronic medica		
28	records be reviewed.

2 3	Jon Pellett, Esquire addressed the Committee and stated the Board did not have the authority to charge different prices to different entities. He indicated there are entities that work on behalf of
4	the government that request medical records and would be charged the higher price.

6	Mr. Mullins pointed out that often times attorney's request medical records on behalf of the
7	patient and then that cost is passed on to the patient.

15	Board of Nursing's rules regarding protocols. He suggested revising the rule to be consistent.
