# **Major Activities for FY 08-09**

Chair's Recognition Award	The award winners for FY 08-09: Lewis E. Auerbach, M.D. – February 2009	
Highlights of Legislation that Passed in 2009	HB 387ER - Medical Faculty Certificates; Increases maximum number of medical faculty certificates issued to faculty at certain institutions.	
	SB 1986ER - primarily deals with reducing health care fraud. It also requires health care boards to deny licensure or to revoke licensure of an individual, who has certain felony convictions or was terminated for cause from the Medicare or Medicaid programs. Similar restrictions apply to health care entities and their officers and affiliated persons. The bill also outlines four new disciplinary violations and requires the Department of Health to work with the Agency for Health Care Administration to prosecute Physicians who have not remitted amounts owed to the state for overpayments. This bill also exempts sleep related testing facilities from the Patient Self Referral Act.	
	SB 462ER - requires the Department of Health, when funds are available, to develop a comprehensive electronic database system for the purpose of implementing a controlled substance prescription drug monitoring program. Effective now, section 14 of the bill requires proper identification before controlled substances are released by the dispensing practitioner to a person not known to the dispenser (see bill for details and definition of "proper identification). This bill also requires registration/inspection or accreditation of certain clinics that perform pain management. The Boards of Medicine and Osteopathic will be conducting public meetings to develop standards for physicians practicing in these pain management clinics. 	• SB 720ER - requires the Board of Medicine to review, every three years, previously approved Board entities that grant board certification in Dermatology. This bill also lifts the requirement for supervising physicians to co-sign charts written and prepared by Physician Assistants. In addition, this bill lifts certain limitations on Advanced Registered Nurse Practitioners and Physician assistants who are only performing hair removal with lasers.	
	SB 2188ER – concerns administrative procedures. New procedures include a requirement that health care boards with electronic agendas place copies of the public agenda materials on their web sites at least 7 days prior to the meeting. It also requires the boards to place a copy of their meeting notices on the

#### **Rule Amendments for FY 08-09**

During FY 08-09, the Board drafted new rules and amended several existing rules in a continued effort to improve the quality of health care, increase patient safety, and to increase the efficiency of the Board. Some rule highlights are noted below:

#### **Board of Medicine Rules:**

### Rule 64B8-1.007, FAC – List of Approved Forms; incorporated

This rule was updated as the applications were updated regarding the ADA questions on the applications.

#### Rule 64B8-4.009, FAC – Applications

This rule was updated as the applications were updated regarding the ADA questions on the applications.

#### Rule 64B8-8.001, FAC – Disciplinary Guidelines

The Board revised this rule to address the violations which would be appropriate for CME and community service with regarding to penalties. Certain guidelines were updated to include the requirement for probation following suspension.

#### Rule 64B8-8.004, FAC – Permanent Revocation

This rule was revised to make a technical correction to the specific authority cite.

### Rule 64B8-8.0011, FAC – Notice of Noncompliance

This rule was amended to address initial offenses of minor violations which are appropriate for the issuance of a notice of noncompliance.

#### Rule 64B8-10.003, FAC – Costs of Reproduction of Medical Records

This rule was amended to increase the costs for reproduction of medical records.

#### Rule 64B8-11.002, FAC – Advertising of HIV/AIDS Status

This rule was revised to make a technical correction where the rule incorrectly referred to the Agency for Health Care Administration instead of the Department of Health.

#### Rule 64B8-12.001, FAC – Applicability (Financial Responsibility)

This rule was amended to make a technical correction in the wording.

#### Rule 64B8-13.005, FAC – Continuing Education for Biennial Renewal

This rule was amended to delete reference to the Medical Advisory Committee and to clarify that a physician may receive 5 hours risk management or ethics CME for attendance at a Board Meeting.

#### **Physician Assistant Rules:**

#### Rule 64B8-30.003, FAC – Physician Assistant Licensure

This rule was updated as the applications were updated regarding the ADA questions on the applications.

#### Rule 64B8-30.005, FAC – Physician Assistant Licensure Renewal and Reactivation

This rule was amended to address requirements and credit for continuing education.

#### Rule 64B8-30.008, FAC – Formulary

This rule was amended to address changes to the Formulary resulting from legislative action.

#### Rule 64B8-30.013, FAC – Notices of Noncompliance

This rule was amended to address minor violations which are appropriate for issuance of a notice of noncompliance.

## Rule 64B8-30.014, FAC – Citation Authority

This rule was amended to address auditing the licensee following the issuance of a citation for a violation of failing a CE audit.

#### Rule 64B8-30.015, FAC – Disciplinary Guidelines

This rule was amended to ensure the PA guidelines were similar to the MD guidelines.

# **Anesthesiologist Assistant Rules:**

# Rule 64B8-31.003, FAC – Application for Licensure

This rule was updated as the applications were updated regarding the ADA questions on the applications.

# Rule 64B8-31.005, FAC – Anesthesiologist Assistant Performance and Protocols

This rule was amended to increase the number of AA's that a physician may supervise from 2 to 4.

## **Other Rules:**

<u>Rule 64B8-52.004, FAC – Requirements for Approval of Training Courses for Laser and Light-based Hair Removal or Reduction</u>

This rule was amended to revise the requirement regarding the number of years of post-graduate training for instructors teaching laser and light-based hair removal courses from two years to one year.

## Surgical Care & Quality Assurance Committee Activities

## **Topics of Discussion:**

Wrong site surgery

The Surgical Care Committee continued its focus to reduce the incidence of wrong site surgery by requesting and reviewing statistics, looking for trends that would offer some insight into the root cause and possible ways to a reduction in the number of cases heard by the Board each year.

#### **Special Meetings:**

### December 4, 2008: Discussion on Wrong Site Surgery

The Surgical Care Committee held an open discussion on wrong site surgery on December 4, 2008, which included several guest speakers. The purpose of the discussion was to explore different ways to reduce the incidences of wrong site surgeries by inviting guests from different organizations who would be associated when a wrong site surgery occurred.

- Guest Speaker: Lance F. Grenevicki, M.D., Florida Patient Safety Corporation Dr. Grenevicki reported that the Florida Patient Safety Corporation(FPSC) had applied and been approved as the first nationally recognized patient safety corporation by the Federal government. The FPSC is in the process of developing new strategies that would focus on a database for near miss reporting, education of students and continuing education for medical professionals in our state.
- Guest Speaker: Robert K. McCann, D.O. Chair Board of Osteopathic Medicine

Dr. McCann, Chair, of the Board of Osteopathic Medicine stated that the Board was focusing on the "team" approach and that a major concern was late reporting of adverse incidents. He stated that physicians who perform wrong site surgery should to give lectures on wrong site surgery and the "pause" or "time out" to medical students, medical societies and other professional groups about the seriousness of wrong site surgery.

• Guest Speaker: Gary Dolin, M.D., Florida Society of Ophthalmologists

Dr. Dolin, representing the Florida Society of Ophthalmologists, stated that the Society was surprised by the high numbers of wrong site surgeries in their specialty. The Society

has taken action to provide continuing education and information to their members. They have also teamed with the National Organization to offer continuing education at the annual conventions.

#### February 5, 2009: Discussion on Pain Management and Pain Clinics

#### **Guest Speakers:**

Rafael Miguel, M.D. Debra Tracy, M.D.

The Committee discussed the proliferation of pain clinics in South Florida, the safety threat to the public by way of drug addiction and overdosing on the liberal amount of medication received from the pain management clinics.

Dr. Rafael Miguel informed the Committee that a bill had been submitted to the legislature that would create a reporting system for all prescribed controlled substances in the state. The Committee requested that a friendly amendment be added to the bill, to create the authority to regulate pain management clinics and require registration and inspections of the pain management facilities.

The amendment was added to the bill and the bill passed. It was signed by the governor in June. The reporting system and the authority to regulate the pain management clinics is now in rule development. Registration and inspections for pain clinics will go into effect in January 2010.

#### April 2, 1009: Medical Spas (Discussion continued on June 4, 2009)

#### **Guest Speakers:**

Chris Nuland, Esq. Representing the Florida Society of Plastic Surgeons and the Florida Society of Dermatologists

Dr. James Matas, President of Florida Society of Plastic Surgeons

At the April 2, 2009 Surgical Care Committee, Dr. Cline requested that this discussion be tabled until the June 4, 2009 meeting, so the Committee would have enough time to review the materials and discuss the issue.

Dr. Matas was allowed to address the committee since he had made a special trip to take part in the discussions.

He suggested the Committee answer the following:

- What is a medical spa?
- Who are the individuals actually doing the treatments?
- What regulation is needed for the facilities and individuals performing the procedures?

# May 19, 2009: Telephone Conference Call with Representatives from the Agency for Health Care Administration

#### **Guests:**

Marie Kokol, LHRM, AHCA Ann Serantis, ACHA Polly Weaver, ACHA Dr. John McDonough, Board of Nursing

The Committee met with representatives from AHCA via telephone conference to discuss the topic of wrong site surgery. The Committee was requesting information on how the Agency viewed wrong site surgery and what types of discipline was given when a wrong site surgery was performed in a facility. A meeting with the AHCA representatives will be scheduled after they have collected some data to share on outcomes of reported wrong site surgeries.

## June 4, 2009: Continued discussion on Medical Spas

### **Guest Speakers:**

Christina Bello-Quintero, MD Monica Vega, University of Miami,

Dr. Onelia Lage, Vice Chair, introduced Dr. Bello-Quintero (a recent graduate) and Monica Vega, a medical student at the University of Miami. Both Dr. Bello-Quintero and Ms. Vega created a poster about Medical spas that was presented to the Committee members.

Dr. Lage led the discussion. The Committee determined that there is not enough data available to make a knowledgeable decision about the need to seek statutory authority to regulate medical spas. The data is not available because there are no reporting requirements or any way to track issues that arise from treatments performed in a medical spa.

Chril Nuland, Esq. who represents Florida Society of Plastic Surgeons and Florida Society of Dermatologists, stated that he would poll the member of the Societies for incidences related to medical spa treatment that needed treatment by a plastic surgeon or dermatologist. He plans to present the data at the October or December Surgical Care Committee meeting.

The discussion also emphasized that multiple regulatory boards would have to be included in any efforts to propose laws and rules that would regulate the "medical spa".

Further discussion will be planned at a later meeting.






